

Privacy Policy for Oakland Dental

Introduction

At Oakland Dental, protecting the privacy and confidentiality of your personal health information is paramount. This Privacy Policy outlines our commitment to safeguarding your information and explains how we collect, use, disclose, and protect your data in accordance with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and other applicable laws and regulations.

Information We Collect

Patient Information: We collect a variety of personal and health information necessary for providing comprehensive dental care. This may include:

Full name

Date of birth

Address

Phone number(s)

Email address

Emergency contact information

Insurance information (including policy numbers and group numbers)

Medical history (e.g., pre-existing conditions, allergies, medications)

Dental history (e.g., past treatments, procedures, x-rays)

Treatment plans and progress notes

Payment Information: We collect financial information, such as credit card details or bank account information, to facilitate payment processing, billing, and insurance claims.

Communications: We may collect information from your communications with us, including inquiries, feedback, complaints, and appointment scheduling requests. This may include records of phone calls, emails, or in-person conversations.

Website Usage: When you visit our website, we may collect certain information automatically, such as your IP address, browser type, device information, and browsing patterns. This data is collected through cookies and similar technologies for analytical and operational purposes.

Healthcare Operations: We may share your information for healthcare operations purposes, such as conducting quality assessment and improvement activities, auditing functions, and compliance monitoring.

Data Security

We employ a comprehensive range of administrative, technical, and physical safeguards to protect your information from unauthorized access, use, disclosure, alteration, or destruction. These measures include, but are not limited to:

Secure data storage and transmission protocols

Access controls and authentication mechanisms

Encryption of sensitive data

Regular security assessments and audits

Staff training on data privacy and security best practices

Children's Privacy

We do not knowingly collect or solicit personal information from children under the age of 13 without parental consent. If you believe that your child has provided us with personal information without your consent, please contact us immediately so that we can take appropriate action to remove such information from our records.

Your Rights

As a patient, you have certain rights regarding your personal health information, including the right to:

Access your health records

Request corrections to inaccuracies or omissions in your records

Request restrictions on how your information is used or disclosed

Receive an accounting of certain disclosures of your information

Request confidential communication of your information
